

HEALTH FACTS PNEUMONIA VACCINES FOR SENIORS

Pneumococcal pneumonia, meningitis, and bloodstream infections kills tens of thousands annually in the United States. Of those deaths, 18,000 are adults ages 65 and older.

Pneumococcal disease is also responsible for serious illness such as heart problems, hearing loss, seizures, blindness and paralysis. The Advisory panel for the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommend seniors get Prevnar 13 and Pnemovax 23 vaccines, 12 months apart. This is because they induce an immune response in different ways.

Both vaccines are paid for by insurance companies and Medicare.

The vaccines last a lifetime, unless your doctor directs otherwise.

Bible Facts

The Old Testament was written in Hebrew; however, original Hebrew was written only with consonants. The consonants were developed about 1100 B.C. The vowel symbols were added to the Hebrew documents after the resurrection of Jesus. Punctuation was introduced after the time of Jesus and was added slowly until it was finalized after 600 A.D. Dividing the Bible into "chapters" was introduced by Stephan Langton in 1205, who was a university professor in Paris. Designation of "verses" was accomplished later by Robert Stephanus, a printer. Theodor Beza applied this same method of chapters and verses to the Old "Vowel sounds" were Testament in 1571. gradually introduced to the printed Old Testament between 500 to 600 years after Jesus, but it wasn't finalized until the time of the Protestant Reformation.

The New Testament was written in "koine" Greek, the form of Greek used by less educated people, and also by traders wandering through Israel.
