


#### JOY TO THE WORLD! THE LORD IS COME. LET EARTH RECEIVE HER KING

God's blessings, Pat Friedrich The hymn, "O Come, All Ye Faithful," was written by John Francis Wade, an 18th century Catholic layman involved in the music business in France. Copies of the hymn migrated to Portugal and then to England. First written in Latin — the original version begins with the words, Adeste Fideles — an Anglican clergyman, Frederick Oakley, translated it into English. Today it is one of the most popular Advent/Christmas hymns, and is sung by Christians around the world.

One of the reasons for its popularity is the joyful character of its words and music. "O Come, all ye faithful, joyful and triumphant," it says — and the music has a joyful, triumphant lilt to go with the joyful, triumphant words.

The hymn calls us to come to Bethlehem to behold the baby Jesus. It calls us to come and adore him. It reminds us of the angel choir that accompanied Jesus' birth — and of the shepherds who gathered around his cradle. It reminds us that God calls us, too, to sing Christ's praises — and to give him glory in this Christmas season.

Christmas is a busy season, and we have a thousand things on our minds and a thousand things to do. But through it all, let us remember to come and adore the Christ who came into the world in this season to bring us light for our darkness — and joy — and life eternal.

#### **HEALTH FACTS - MENIERE'S DISEASE**

Meniere's disease is a disorder of the inner ear that causes episodes in which you fell as if you're spinning (vertigo), and you have fluctuating hearing loss with a progressive, ultimately permanent loss of hearing, ringing in the ear (tinnitus), and sometimes a feeling of fullness or pressure in your ear. In most cases, Meniere's disease affects only one ear. It causes you to lose balance and fall.

The cause of Meniere's disease isn't understood. One popular theory, that hasn't been proved, is that it appears to be the result of the abnormal amount of fluid in the inner ear.

Why do we get too much fluid in the inner ear? Possibly improper drainage or blockage; abnormal immune response, allergies, viral infection, genetics, or head trauma.

## NOTES FROM CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING - NOVEMBER 7, 2018

A thank you note was received from the Andrew Helmreich family for St. Johns' prayers and desserts prepared for his celebration of life.

Financials reports: Offering \$5,751.00 plus other income of \$385.00 made total income for October \$6,136.00. Total expenses: \$5,177.98. The balance as of 10.31.18 in the checkbook is \$16,311.99. Two items to be discussed at the Annual Meeting in January: Planning of the 2019 Harvest Festival, including changing the date and discussion as to locking the doors of the church when the service begins.

Entrance to the church during inclement weather will be the East and West side entrances only. Updated guidelines from the Missouri Mid-South Conference of the UCC for minimum compensation of ministers have been made available. This points out that there has been a 2% increase in pastor salaries.

The next council meeting will be December 5 at 6:00 pm.
