# **40th Annual Harvest Festival**

Thank you, thank you, thank you to everyone who planned, cooked, baked, donated, served, washed dishes, took out the trash, sold baked goods and crafts, carried tables and chairs, put up tents or just came out in the rain to enjoy a delicious meal and visit with friends! It was a dreary, rainy day but we had a very successful Harvest Festival and we couldn't have done it without all of you!

Fellowship Hall was filled with the noises of food preparation, sounds of children pretending to whatever character was painted on their face and giggles from the storage room turned into a playroom. Our best count is that we served around 160 people and they all seemed to enjoy the smoked brisket, baked ham, two kinds of potatoes, two kinds of beans, a variety of salads and homemade pies galore, all of which topped the list of "the best I ever ate!"

Tables were set up in the sanctuary to display the huge variety of baked good, crafts, and handmade items in the Country Store as well as the items for the silent auction. After enjoying their meal, many people filled the pews to visit and watch a slide show of pictures from previous Harvest Festivals.

The donations from the meal totaled \$3,202. The silent & live auctions made \$3,912 and the Country Store took in \$1,198.55. After expenses, our profit (as of this publication) was \$6,733.48! A decision will be made at the annual meeting in January as to how we want to use this money to help others.

# ADULT BIBLE STUDY SUNDAY MORNINGS AT 9:30 A.M.

Job, Chapter 8 vs 9-22. Bidad is telling Job that life is fragile like a spider's web; it gives way when leaned on.

Chapter 9 vs 1-35. Job replies and shows humility as he accepts his losses (family, livestock, crops). He attempts to bring acceptance of his situation. He may be close to despair and depression and giving up.

Chapter 10 vs. 1-22. Job questions God because he feels useless and angry. We remember how Peter was angry toward Jesus. A question to ponder: How does one control their anger?

Chapter 14 vs. 1-22. This is an example of Old Testament theology. Job addressed God and describes God as punishing him. He is aware of his sins and wrongdoing of his youth and now regrets his actions. A question to ponder: What is the real image of God? Imago Dei is a theological term of image of God. Each of us have the capacity of good and evil and the will to choose good is the image of God.

#### **HEALTH FACTS**

E-Cigarettes

Electronic cigarettes are battery-operated devices which heat a liquid solution turning it into a vapor that can be inhaled. Using e-cigarettes is often referred to as vaping.

The liquid can contain nicotine, flavorings, propylene glycol and vegetable glycerin. The devices have refillable cartridges. The contents of this e-liquid should be on the package.

In mid-2019, U.S. state health departments reported more than 200 potential cases of serious lung illness associated with use of vaping devices. A specific device hasn't been determined. The CDC is recommending that people need to stop vaping now as they investigate the cause of the lung illness.

E-cigarettes aren't approved by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) as a quit smoking aid. Research has shown that teen use of e-cigarettes is on the rise and associated with increased future use of traditional cigarettes.

# Bible Facts

The world "Bible" ("biblos", in the Greek) simply means, "library of little books". How many books of what Christians refer to as "Old Testament" were actually declared as books defining the Jewish faith? There were 39 books declared as "canon" ("canon" means "measuring rod") by Jewish leaders for Jewish people, and this was done between 90 and 95 A.D., when Christians were becoming a serious threat to Judaism. The books which ultimately became part of the Hebrew "canon" were written between about 1100 B.C. to perhaps as late as 100 B.C. There are many books written in the OT period of time, which the scholars simply declared: "No, these books do not define the Jewish faith"! Most of these books were declared: "Pseudepigrapha", which means "false writings".

"The Word of God" for the ancient Hebrews was the "Torah" or the 5 books of Moses, i.e., Genesis, Exodus, Numbers, Leviticus and Deuteronomy. Ultimately, in the NT, Jesus has been defined as "The Word of God". The NT, when properly defined, is the "witness to the Word of God"! {or Jesus}. This is a very important distinction. We can hold the Bible in our hands and shake it in someone else's face and demand, "Do you believe this is "the Word of God?" Ultimately this book is only "the Word of God" when its message **shakes you in some way that changes your life!** If the Bible doesn't shake up your life in some way, then the words on those pages are just useless words on paper!
