# Stained Glass Repair Project News Our window repair project has been completed!

The last of the windows were reinstalled on June 21. Kevin and Lynn from O'Brien Stained Glass cleaned and repaired the glass, replaced the mismatched glass, and repainted the frames. They replaced all of the lead channels and improved the lines to enhance the design. The old storm windows were replaced with tempered storm coverings which removed shadows and lets the light shine through! It also makes them look more beautiful from the outside.

The total cost of the project was \$59,625. We collected \$41,847 in donations and the congregation approved using \$15,000 from the Memorial Fund. With the interest earned on the donations, we only needed to use \$2,646.40 from the General Fund. Thank you so much to everyone who donated to this project.

We would like to give a great big thank you to Scott Grissum for spear-heading this project and seeing it all the way through. Thanks also to everyone who helped take the windows out, cleaned the sanctuary after each phase, and provided fellowship to Kevin and Lynn on their many visits to our church. He said he was going to miss us!

#### HEALTH FACTS ATHLETE'S FOOT

Athlete's foot (tinea pedis) is a fungal infection that usually begins between the toes. It commonly occurs in people whose feet have become very sweaty while confined within tight fitting shoes. It is closely related to other skin fungal infections such as ringworm and jock itch. Signs and symptoms include a scaly rash that usually causes itching, stinging, and burning. It can be contagious and spread on floors, towels, or clothing. Keep your feet dry and be sure to dry between the toes after bathing. Change socks twice a day if feet are sweaty. Don't wear the same pair of shoes every day so each pair can dry out. Use an antifungal powder daily. If you develop a rash, use over-the-counter antifungal cream such as Lamisil (not recommended for children).
