
Stained Glass Window History

The present church building was built and dedicated in 1916. There wasn't enough money to purchase stained glass windows for the new church, so the church leaders decided to offer the members the option of donating memorial stained glass windows for the new church, and several families responded. The notation on some of the windows, "zum andenken an loosely translated means "in memory of...".

Stained glass windows are found in some Christian Churches, but not in others. Historically, congregations from the Congregational-Christian side of the United Church of Christ did not include stained glass windows with any sort of images. On the other hand, German churches, especially from the Evangelical side of the United Church of Christ, usually had at least a few stained glass windows picturing something about Jesus or about one or more of the parable which Jesus told. Congregations from the German Evangelical side of the church were strongly influenced by the Lutheran branch of the church back in Germany.

Stained glass windows with proper care can last for a very long time and our windows are already more than 100 years old. Are these picture windows to be worshiped somehow? No of course not. They are merely symbols which remind us about something important in our historical faith. Our ancestors at St. Johns cared about their faith, and they cared about the ways they wanted to share their faith with those who followed in their steps.



The major theme window is showing Jesus as "The Good Shepherd", tenderly caring for his flock of sheep. This is one of several favorite themes picturing the tender, caring nature of Jesus for his followers, and thus by implication, the tender, caring nature of the heavenly Father. The sheep learn by association that their shepherd will lead them to places where there is food to eat and water to drink. The sheep,

the shepherd routinely.

This window has a white lily, a traditional symbol of resurrection and eternal life. It was given in memory of Pastor Behrens,



The Bible window, is above the altar, has arrow pointing into all the world, suggesting the instruction given by Jesus that we are to spread the "good news" into all of the world.

HEALTH FACTS CHRONIC OBSTRUCTIVE PULMONARY DISEASE (COPD)

Shortness of breath with rest or exertion, a chronic cough, and wheezing are symptoms of COPD. Risk factors include age, smoking history, exposure to indoor or outdoor air pollution, occupational dusts, or chemicals.

Diagnosis is made by a test called spirometry to detect airflow obstruction and its severity in the lungs. COPD causes the airflow and volume of air to be diminished.

Treatment will start with smoking cessation and inhaled medications. The purpose of the inhaled medications is to stabilize the air flow and reduce chances of decline or hospitalizations. Usually one inhaler is used at first and this decision is based on patient preference, adverse side effects, and cost.

If symptoms progress, inhaled steroids are added to improve the quality of life. Oxygen may be needed long-term when the blood oxygen level is 88% or less. Patients who are using oxygen should use it for at least 15 hours per day to achieve a target oxygen saturation of 88% to 92%.

People with COPD need to have annual flu vaccines and two pneumonia shots (Pneumovax and Prevnar 13) two years apart.

Pulmonary rehabilitation programs are structured to provide exercise training, education of this disease, nutritional counseling and what to do to reduce shortness of breath and increase exercise ability. ~Nancy Meyer
