MEMORIAL DAY SERVICE MONDAY, MAY 27TH AT 9:30 A.M.

Everyone is invited to the Memorial Service held at the St. Johns UCC Cemetery. The Women’s Guild will provide coffee and juice and attendees are asked to bring their favorite brunch item for the fellowship time after the service.

If you noticed a paper scroll hanging in the front of the church, it is a Lent/Easter banner being made by the Sunday school. The first Sunday of Lent we talked about how this season of 40 days before Easter is to remind us of the 40 days that Jesus spent in the wilderness being tempted by Satan. We talked about what kind of things tempt us and what are some kindnesses that we can do during this time. Purple is the universal church color of Lent so we sponge painted our banner purple. Every week as Lent has progressed, we have unrolled a little more of our purple banner so it looks bigger. On the Sunday before Easter it will be full size. For Good Friday we will sponge black over the



purple to symbolize Jesus' death. On the first Sunday of Lent we also collected hand tracings from the congregation during the soup luncheon. As part of the Easter Egg hunt activities we transformed this purple blackened banner with colorful tissue paper and use the hand prints to make a vine of white flowers. On Easter our banner will celebrate Jesus arising from the dead in full color with all the congregation represented in it. We are also making a "prayer flag" string of colorful scraps of fabric with everyone's hands to hang. For this project we are using materials left over from vacation bible school that Jessica and Megan tie dyed a few years back.

ADULT BIBLE STUDY – Sunday Mornings at 9:30

Psalm 23: Pastor Jim read this Psalm and then asked these questions:

Vs. 1: What imagery do you have? Most thought of the large stain glass window depicting Jesus carrying a lamb.

Vs.2: Why would sheep lay down? Maybe to chew their cud after finding cool shade. The still waters would be a safe place for sheep to drink.

Vs.3: What does it mean to restore my soul? Each shared their vision of peace, rest, staying calm in the mist of conflict.

Vs. 4: What is a staff? It could be used to corral sheep, catch wandering sheep, or as a weapon for protection. The valley would be a darkness where anxiety and fears can be overwhelming. We can seek comfort in God's presence.

Vs. 5: What is a banquet? That is an easy answer since we are experts at St. Johns in preparing food. This can provide nourishment and even peace in spite of sadness. We can count blessings and be happy.

Vs. 5: Anointing my head with oil is a symbol that you have been chosen and receive a blessing of healing.

Vs. 6: The House of the Lord in this case would be the Temple. This passage has Bible scholars questioning whether David wrote this Psalm because it is more "polished" than his other writings and God did not give permission to David to build a Temple.

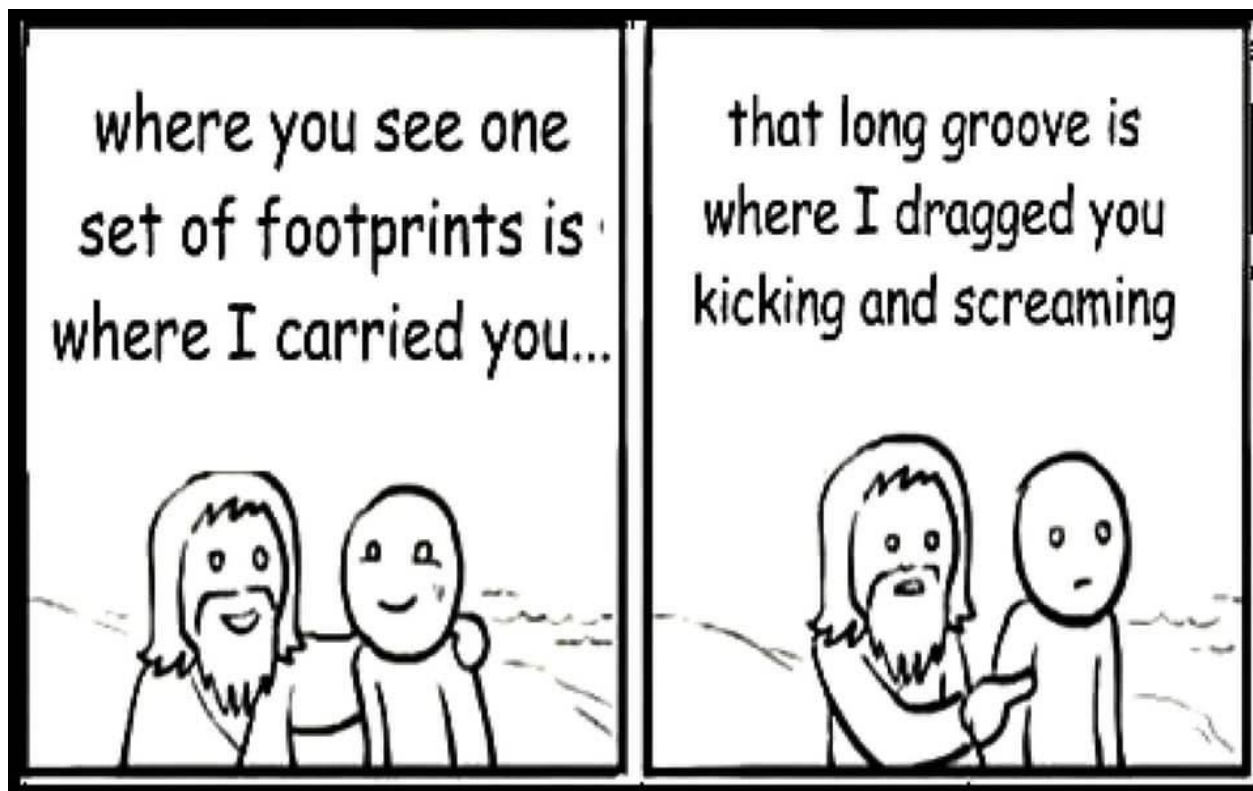
