### **Shoebox Information & Helpful Tips**

Collection Day is Sunday, November 3

- 1. Boys are the ones least chosen to pack for. Ages 2-4 and 10-14 least chosen.
- 2. Flip flops are highly recommended for boxes so children won't have to walk barefoot; so dangerous!
- 3. Walmart and Dollar Tree stores have solar calculators for  $% \left\{ 1\right\} =\left\{ 1\right$
- \$1. Recommended for age 10-14 age boxes. Solar is important.
- 4. Remove all or most all packaging/plastic from toys etc. so they won't have to deal with extra trash.
- 5. Put LOTS of pencils (and small sharpener/s) in each shoebox; they will share.
- 6. Dollar Tree stores have almost everything you need for your boxes for one dollar or less.
- 7. No toothpaste or candy in the boxes.
- 8. Please include a card, letter or picture of you and your family so the child knows a real person cared enough to give him/her a gift. There are letters on the front pew for children to color and send in boxes.
- 9. Also on the front pew are boxes, brochures, labels, extra toothbrushes, rubber bands (to secure the box) etc. Help vourself.
- 10. PRAY FOR THE CHILD WHO WILL RECEIVE YOUR BOX AS YOU PREPARE IT.

If you are not able to fill a box, but would like to participate, you may donate funds (\$9 per box) for postage. Please make checks payable to Samaritan's Purse and give them to Marg.



# An Operation Christmas Child Story from Namibia

In an informal settlement on the outskirts of the capital of the southern African nation of Namibia, many are unemployed. The fortunate operate small businesses out of their makeshift corrugated metal homes. No one has electricity or running water. "You have to have a tough heart to live in Havana," said 18-year-old resident Endenette Klaasen.

Recently, 60 children gathered in a local church in Havana for an Operation Christmas Child outreach event. After a time of singing, Endenette clearly explained the Gospel. Hearts had been softened to the Good News, and almost every child accepted Christ as Savior.

While angels rejoiced in Heaven (Luke 15: 10), a collective gasp went up in the room. Leaders pulled sheets off of two piles of colorful stacks of shoebox gifts. Children tore into them with squeals of joy. "It made me feel 13 years old again," Endenette said.

Five years ago, she received a similar shoebox-her first gift ever. In it, Endenette found soap, pencils, a washcloth, cosmetics, a


gray T-shirt, and blue jeans.

Also in her

shoebox was a Christian booklet. Endenette had been wrestling with the question, "Who is this Jesus?" and through that booklet she discovered the answer: "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me" (John 14:6). Right then, Endenette prayed to receive Christ as Savior.

Today she's active in her church and leads outreach events for Operation Christmas Child. Since she grew up an orphan, Endenette sees the Body of Christ as her true family. Her mother died in 2004, the year before she entered first grade, and she's never known her father. She used to question why the Lord took her mother. "But He strengthened me," she said. "I left it all to God."

Now in grade 12, rather than focusing on herself, Endenette devotes herself to serving Christ her Lord and sharing His Gospel.

# HEALTH FACTS FLU SHOTS

This year's annual flu shot will offer protection against three or four of the influenza viruses expected to be in circulation this flu season. A high-dose flu vaccine also will be available for adults age 65 and older.

It takes up to two weeks to build immunity after a flu shot, but you can benefit from the vaccine even if you don't get it until after the flu season starts. It's usually best for people to get their flu shot by the end of October.

Because flu viruses evolve so quickly, yearly vaccines are made to protect you from this year's viruses. When you get vaccinated, your immune system produces antibodies to protect from the viruses.

The vaccine can't give you the flu. But you might develop flu-like symptoms because your body's production of protective antibodies or you could have been exposed to the flu virus prior to getting the shot. Various illnesses can mimic the flu symptoms. See your doctor if you have concerns.
