The pastoral search committee met with the Evangelical UCC search committee and Rev. Tyler Connoley, Minister for Search and Call Discernment of Missouri Mid-South Conference. The council discussed how cooperation between the two churches could be successful. Another meeting will be July 24th, 2019, at St. Johns UCC between church councils and search committees and Rev. Connoley.

Every Child's Hope sent a thank you note for the monetary donation. The Ebenezer UCC church in Levasy, Missouri, has requested a love offering after their church suffered damage from Missouri River flooding. This will be shared with the congregation at the next meeting.

Church membership criteria were discussed with reference to the present Constitution and Bylaws. Suggestions will be reviewed by the council again at the August meeting.

HEALTH FACTS – Kids Eye Health

Children who are exposed to excessive "screen time" can develop digital eye strain. Smartphone screens emit blue light, which can interrupt sleep patterns, cause short term damage to photoreceptors in the eyes, blurred vision, dry eyes, sensitivity to light, and headaches.

To reduce "screen time", use the 20-20-20 rule: Take a break every 20 minutes to look 20 feet away for 20 seconds.

Also exposure to UV rays, i.e. sun, can cause harm to the eyes. Children are more vulnerable to retinal damage from UV rays because their eyes are clearer and they tend to spend more time outdoors. Have children wear sunglasses with UV 400 protection or higher. Polycarbonate lenses are stronger for children's sunglasses so shop for those types. ~Nancy
