One Solitary Life

Here is a man who was born in an obscure village, the child of a peasant woman. He grew up in another village. He worked in a carpenter shop until He was thirty. Then for three years He was an itinerant preacher.

He never owned a home. He never wrote a book. He never held an office. He never had a family. He never went to college. He never put His foot inside a big city. He never traveled two hundred miles from the place He was born. He never did one of the things that usually accompany greatness. He had no credentials but Himself...

While still a young man, the tide of popular opinion turned against him. His friends ran away. One of them denied Him. He was turned over to His enemies. He went through the mockery of a trial. He was nailed upon a cross between two thieves. While He was dying His executioners gambled for the only piece of property He had on earth – His coat. When He was dead, He was laid in a borrowed grave through the pity of a friend.

[Twenty] long centuries have come and gone, and today He is a centerpiece of the human race and leader of the column of progress.

I am far within the mark when I say that all the armies that ever marched, all the navies that were ever built; all the parliaments that ever sat and all the kings that ever reigned, put together, have not affected the life of man upon this earth as powerfully as has that one solitary life.

HEALTH FACTS

COVID-19 VACCINE

A recent article from Mayo Clinic on the COVID-19 vaccine dated December 8, 2020, explains the safety and efficacy of the COVID-19 vaccine. The article documents that Pfizer and Moderna, drug companies, are using a new technology that is based on the molecular structure of the virus and does not require it to be "grown" in animal material such as eggs. The vaccines induce an immune response against proteins attached to the virus. These are inactivated vaccines, not live-virus vaccines. Trials or testing on volunteers have been studied over months. Safety experts independently evaluate the data of the vaccine use before approval. The safety of COVID-19 vaccine will continue to be closely monitored by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the FDA. These are the experts who approve drugs that we take in our normal life.

Thus far the new vaccine has shown only shortterm mild or moderate vaccine reactions, and these seem to resolve without complication or injury. While some people who receive the vaccine may develop symptoms as their immune system responds, this is common when receiving any vaccine, and these symptoms are not considered serious or life-threatening.

It's important to recognize that getting vaccinated for COVID-19 is not just about survival from COVID-19, it's about preventing spread of the virus to others and preventing infection that can lead to long-term negative health effects.

While no vaccine is 100% effective, the benefits of receiving the vaccine outweigh the risks in healthy people.

Call your doctor or health care provider if you have doubts or fears of this vaccine since they are the experts in caring for your health.


